## Walk Details

A coastal walk against the back drop of one of Donegal's iconic landmarks - Bloody Foreland. The route is signposted as part of the Bealach na Gaeltachta - Sli an Earagail.

**Distance:** Approximately 13 kms

**Time:** 2 - 3 hours

**Terrain:** Quiet roads, bog road/rough track.

**Grading:** Moderate - although there is no climbing involved, the route underfoot can be rough in places and sections of the walk can feel remote, particularly in poor weather.

## Getting There

The walk can start/end at either its northern end at Bunaniver (approx 2kms west of Falcarragh) or its southern end at Lough Aninver (approx 4.5 kms north of Derrybeg).

Parking is limited at both locations and visitors are asked to park sensitively and to ensure that parked vehicles do not obstruct access for local people or work activities.
